Technological Innovations on end-of-life management of DSRS

- IAEA funded training course under the Interregional Project INT 9182: Sustaining the Cradle to Grave Management of Sealed Radioactive Sources was hosted by South Africa (Necsa), 25 to 29 September 2017.

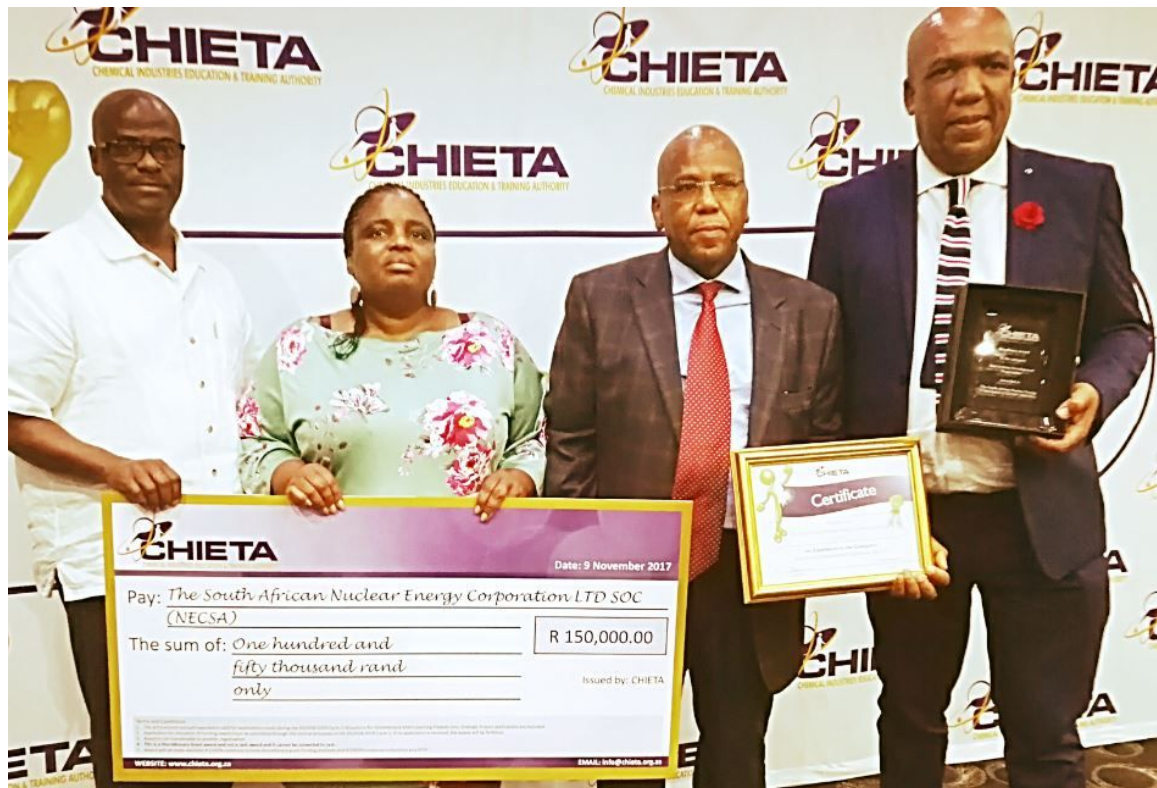
NECSA GROUP WINS CHIETA EXCELLENCE AWARD 2017
